#### iOS devices

- Go to Settings > Accessibility > Spoken Content.
- Tap the toggle switch for "Speak Selection" to switch it on.
- You can now customise the speech rate, default language and listen to an audio sample.
- After that, scan the QR code on the previous page using your camera and scroll down the page to find 'Exhibition Labels'. Click the link to open the PDF of this document.
- Tap the share button (a square with an upwardpointing arrow) and select your PDF reader. This might be the free 'Apple Books' app.
- Highlight the text that you want to read and tap "Speak"

#### **Android devices**

- To use Google Text-to-speech on your Android device, go to Settings > Language & Input.
- Select "Text-to-speech output", and then choose Google Text-to-speech Engine as your preferred engine.
- You can now customise the speech rate, default language and listen to an audio sample.
- To hear items read aloud, tap the Select to Speak icon, then click on a specific word, or drag your finger across the screen to select a longer passage of text, and tap the play button to begin the text-to-speech playback. Alternatively, you can tap the play button to hear everything on screen.

The Creek, created by Vincent Fantauzzo in collaboration with director Baz Luhrmann explores themes of memory, identity and place anchored within the Australian landscape. Drawing on Vincent Fantauzzo's signature cinematic realism and Luhrmann's theatrical storytelling this work stands as one of Fantauzzo's most iconic paintings. It won the Metro Art Award in Melbourne recognising innovation and excellence in contemporary Australian Art and was also exhibited internationally at Art Basel, Hong Kong where it received widespread critical acclaim.

Asher Keddie is one of Australia's most respected and celebrated actresses, best known for her award-winning role in *Offspring*, which earned her a Gold Logie Award in 2013. Her recent work includes, *Fake*, *Strife*, *The Lost Flowers of Alice Hart* and *Nine Perfect Strangers*. Reflecting on painting his wife, Fantauzzo said "I see her in ways other people don't – I see her vulnerability, her strength, her depth. That's what I try to capture. It's very intimate to paint someone you love. There's a trust there, but also a responsibility."

In 2016, Vincent Fantauzzo painted a series of portraits of Indigenous artists some of whom had lived a nomadic existence far from the modern world in the Western Desert. The series, titled *Last Contact* included the portrait of Wentja Napaltjarri, a senior Pintupi artist and daughter of Shorty Lungkata Tjungurrayi and Napulu Nangala. Wentja grew up west of Kintore in the Gibson Desert and has lived in Haasts Bluff, Papunya and Mt. Liebig. Having the opportunity to work with these artists Vincent reflected "For us, it brings to the forefront of our psyche the importance of these Indigenous artists, their work and their country."

In 2007, artist Vincent Fantauzzo created a portrait of actor Heath Ledger for the Archibald Prize. During the process, he completed a number of sketches and drawings of Ledger. The final portrait went on to win the People's Choice Award in 2008. Fantauzzo and Ledger had been close friends for many years prior to the portrait's creation. Ledger had a celebrated film career with notable roles in *Brokeback Mountain* – for which he received an Academy Award nomination – *I'm Not There*, *Candy* and the *Dark Knight*, in which he portrayed the iconic role of the Joker. "The portrait of Heath was very personal for me. The fact that people connected with it means a lot – because it was never just about technique, it was about emotion."
